North Durham Players and Hockey Families,

There are still many unanswered questions regarding the coming hockey

season. NDMHA has been working hard to develop a *return to play plan* based on the requirements provided to us by our sanctioning bodies and our Public Health Unit and local arenas. We are hopeful that North Durham will be on the ice starting in September with a

graduated return to play plan. As we move closer to September, we hope to provide a more in-depth plan regarding

all aspects of the hockey season regardless of age division or level of play. Our current challenges are offering the sport of hockey while observing our new health guidelines such as maintaining social distancing and the number of people who

are allowed to gather. There are new procedures that will need to be implemented such as separate entrances and exits to facilities, dressing room use, health screening, use of masks, spectators etc. Currently the information we are receiving leads us to believe that the start of

Representative hockey will be postponed until it is deemed safe to resume. We are looking into many options in order to get our members returning to the ice in a safe way to have them benefit from the physical and mental benefits that hockey has to offer. At this point we are looking at using September as a player development platform

September. Our September development program and return to play process will be communicated as soon as possible with more details and answers to the many questions our members have.

There will be a fee for the September Development program. The program will be subsidized by NDMHA and we will keep the cost per skate to a minimum level. Our hope is to have all age groups on the ice twice weekly for 50 minutes through the month with all current safety protocols in place as well as certified coaches on the ice following appropriate skill-based drills. We are also hopeful to offer additional

specialised development programs on a fee per skate basis. Please look for more details regarding our September Development programs registration, our return to play plan and the fees required for September Development coming soon. Always keep an eye on the North Durham website. Moving on from there, we are looking at local programming with the hope of creating a Tiered Recreational House League to engage in both skill development and game

situations. Our top tier would run similarly to our Rep program in terms of ice times

and will be balanced by division with former rep players, while our regular house league would follow previous year formats. In order to run any programming, we are relying on our amazing volunteers to support us and deliver the programs. If you can help, please answer the

We know there are many questions to be answered, we thank you for your patience and support. We are very hopeful to have the kids back on the ice in a safe and enjoyable way come September and we all can work together to make this happen. See you at the Rink!!




